Sketch (lightly) before painting to combine line and colour.

Create a colour palette in the natural or built world.

Give details (including own sketches) about the style of some notable artists, artisans, and designers.

Create original pieces that show a range of influences and styles.

RE - Looking after the environment

Show an awareness of morals and right and wrong beyond rules (i.e. wanting to act in a certain way despite rules.) Explain how religious beliefs shape the lives of individuals and communities. Show an understanding of the role of a spiritual leader.

Describe how some of the values held by communities or individuals affect behaviour and actions.

Use maps and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe human and physical features.
