
At the end of this academic year, we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Ferreira and on 30th June, Mr Appleby (aka Mr Football) who are both retiring.




## KS1 Dolphins, Jellyfish and Seahorses

In Maths we have been working on groupings and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. The children have been working hard on this and their multiplication skills are improving hugely.






In Science we have been looking at minibeasts, habitats, animals and living things. The children have enjoyed looking in our school environment for minibeasts.

The children are going to be mapping out their route in geography and making a map of their walk.

Year 3 had the fantastic opportunity to work with Callum from Northumberland Cricket this half term, learning new skills that can be used in a game of cricket. They've worked really well in teams, encouraging and supporting one another.

In Science this half term, we explored light. We considered what a light source is and the difference between natural and artificial. We investigated how light travels and how shadows are formed. We had lots of fun creating shadows using our hands. We also discussed the dangers of the sun and how to protect ourselves.



As part of our Computing curriculum, we completed the First Lego League Explore Project. This year's theme is Masterpiece. We worked in teams to collaborate, communicate, build, learn and play together. We discussed how people's passion for the arts are shared through STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). All children embraced the 6 core values which are Teamwork, Inclusion, Impact, Discovery, Innovation and Fun!









Year 5 enjoyed orienteering around the Rising Sun Country Park. They used their map skills to navigate the park and it kept us all fit moving quickly between checkpoints!
